

Thank you to those of you who completed the parent survey. Here are some of the results, compared to schools like ours.


Q: Overall, my child's experience of the school is...

Health and Wellbeing

Places of Worship

Collection and drop offs

Mornings

The main gates to the school open at 8.30am. Families are welcome to wait in the playground. Members of the senior leadership team will be present but **children from Nursery to year 4 should be accompanied by an adult** and not left in the playground. Only children in years 5&6 can be in the playground unaccompanied.

The doors to the school building open at **8.40am and close at 8.45am**. Families arriving after this time will be asked to take their children round to the school office.

Afternoons

At the end of the day we like to wait of children to come onto the playground before the gates are opened. Please be aware that **lessons finish at 3.15pm**. It may take some classes a few minutes to get down to the playground therefore the main gates will open a few minutes after 3.15pm. The classes are not late, rather they have maximized the children's learning time.

Children who have not been collected by 3.25pm will be taken round to the school office.

Older siblings who attend Mayespark will not be allowed to collect their younger siblings.

Safeguarding procedures

The school strive to keep children safe. Doors to the school building and gates will be shut promptly to secure the site. If there are changes to who will be collecting your child please notify the school office as soon as possible. Teachers will seek clarification from a parent if the person requesting to collect a child is unknown.

Notes from the office

School Uniform

Preloved uniform is available from the main school office. Please let the office know what your child needs. Lost property can be found at the beginning and end of the school day and is stored in a yellow box by the office. Please ensure your child's name is written on their uniform.

After school clubs

If you would like your child to attend an after school club please check with the school office to see if there are any places left.

Medical appointments

Non-emergency appointments should be taken out of school hours. Please send evidence of the emergency appointment to the school office.

Pupil absence

Parents are responsible for calling the school office on a daily basis to report their child's absence

School council

At the beginning of every academic year new children are elected to become the school council representatives. Children from KS2 classes start their campaigns to win the votes of children across the school. Posters, persuasive speeches and even homemade cakes, are used to win the most votes. Once elected the children have the opportunity to express the views of their classmates, be part of important decision making within the school and help to organise whole school events.

Food collection

Every year, around Harvest time, Mayespark supports a local homeless shelter in Ilford by collecting food donations. The new school council have the privilege of visiting the centre to learn more about the amazing work the Welcome Centre does to support those in need. We ask that each child donates one or two items. Mrs Kaur will be leading the school council in organising this annual charitable event.





Redbridge Mental Health team are continuing their support with the School this year by running whole class workshops for children, supporting families on an individual basis as well as running workshops for parents. Our next workshop for parents will take place on 1st October at 9am. The focus of the session will be around promoting positive behaviour, an area that many parents have shared they would value support with. All parents and carers are welcome to attend.

Get involved

At Mayespark we like to encourage parents and carers to get involved in the life of the school. There are many ways in which to do this...

- Every Friday you are welcome to join in with the 'Read with me' session straight after drop off in your child's classroom. Mrs Amey, English Leader and year 2 teacher can give you more details if needed.
