

Behaviour Management and Discipline Policy

The goal of this policy is not to set up consequences and punishments for children when they misbehave, but rather to establish positive expectations for behaviour.

A second goal of this policy is not only to address the outward behaviour of the children, but also to transform their hearts and minds so they understand how to interact with others. The rules of the camp are reflected in these 3 principles:

- 1. Safety
- 2. Respect Property of the school and of Others
- 3. Have Fun

Rules, Rewards and Consequences

The holiday club rules will be displayed and discussed at the start of each day and will be reinforced by all members of staff at all times.

Group leaders may also wish to develop their own rules for specific activities, for example PE, lining-up in class, creative activities etc.

The following rewards encourage good behaviour:

- Stickers,
- Good news notes,
- Conversations with parents at the end of the day.

Disciplinary actions*

Stage One: Child will be given a warning and have a conversation with group leader. Stage Two: Child will be restricted from some activities. A call made to parents to inform them of their child's behaviour.

Stage Three: Further restrictions imposed which may include exclusion from holiday club for half a day. A call to the student's parents to inform them of their child's behaviour at the camp. Conversation with Holiday Club Leader.

Stage Four: Child may be removed from holiday club attendance.

*Any of these steps may be skipped at the discretion of the camp staff based upon the frequency and severity of the behaviour.
