



Please remember further information regarding specific year groups is available in the curriculum menu on the Mayespark Primary website. During Summer 1 we will explore the topic - Relationships.













Children do not therefore have access to these in school and we advise that this is the case at home too.



#### Top tips for staying safe online:

- Use safe search engines such as swiggle.org.uk or kids-search.com. Safe search settings can also be activated on Google and other search engines as well as YouTube. You can find out more at google.co.uk/safetycentre.
- Only talk to real life friends or family if they are on sites with a social media element like Moshi Monsters or Club Penguin. Be a good online friend and don't say nasty things even if it's just a joke.
- Use secure and legal sites to download music and games.
- Make use of the parental controls on your home broadband and any internet-enabled devices. You can find out how at your broadband provider's website or by visiting internetmatters.org.
