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## CURRICULUM NEWS

Our children have had lots of wonderful learning opportunities over the past few weeks. Below are some of the highlights:

### Year 1

Year 1 visited All Saints C of E Church in Goodmayes. The purpose of this visit was for children to learn about the Christian place of worship in a real-life context. They were able to see the things we have talked about in class first-hand and watched the process of a demonstration baptism. The children thoroughly enjoyed looking and identifying the features of a church.









### Year 2

When I woke up on Wednesday 29th June I was very, very happy and excited because I knew we were going on our last ever year 2 trip. At Mayespark, our governors work hard behind the scenes to help ensure high standards are in place within our school. If you have ever wondered what they do, here is an update on some of the ways they have supported the school over the past term.



Last week the Chair of Governors visited our ARCH classes, a provision for children with special needs. She spent time with the teachers and the wonderful children. This is what she reported: The Arch classes provide targeted support which enables the children to make progress, achieve their identified outcomes, as well as for some of the children, it provides intervention whilst at the same time accessing the mainstream classrooms and curriculum throughout the day. The dedicated teaching spaces, sensory rooms, outdoors, routines and sufficient staffing allows not only access to small group teaching but each child is being known as an individual. I was so happy to see that all staff involved knew each child very well. The teachers are both dedicated and committed to the work they do and gave me an insight into the daily lives of the children when in school.



Last month we held a governors' day. This is an annual opportunity for every governor to spend time in school. This year, most governors were able to attend. During the morning they went into different classrooms to see the teaching and learning and then convened for a meeting to discuss the curriculum.

#### PLEASE TURN OFF YOUR ENGINE

We do understand that, in this hot weather, it is tempting to leave your engine running while you wait in your car. However, the air pollution this causes is very damaging to our neighbours and to your children. Not to mention that it is an offence and you could be fined!

Under Regulation 98 of The Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, it is an offence to leave a vehicle engine running unnecessarily while that vehicle is stationary on the roadside. Redbridge have created a Traffic Management Order, under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, so that traffic enforcement officers within the local authority are able to issue Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) of £80 for idling vehicles.

The cost of fuel is still rising, so by turning off your engine you would be saving money too! There really is no good reason to keep your engine running and pollute the air!
