Dear Parents & Carers,

We have reached the end of another academic year! We have continued to make much progress on the Governing Board. Numerous Governor Link Visits have been undertaken during the summer Term, focusing on different areas of our School Development Plan. Writing was a key area we targeted, ensuring progress is being made towards the goals set out during the year. We also focused on pupils with Special Educational Needs, ensuring those students have equal opportunities and appropriate access to the curriculum. In addition to this we met with the Safeguarding Lead of the school to review policies and procedures in line with legislation.

During July, we participated in our Annual Governors' Day. The day started with lesson observations across the school, where it was apparent that the curriculum is relevant, purposeful and inclusive to every child. We conducted book checks and carried out a Pupil Voice. This was followed with a Governing Board Meeting which focused on strategic planning for next year, the financial position of the school and curriculum presentations from subject leaders. We concluded the day with exit interviews with some staff members and met with the School Council to hear about their role in the school this year.

Great progress has been made towards the school improvement plan and we are so proud of the achievements of our Mayespark community. Thank you so much to parents and carers for continuing to support the school and for helping our children thrive. Staff have worked so hard this year to deliver excellent standards for pupils and this has been reflected in our KS2 SATs results this year. We are so pleased with this achievement in what has been a challenging year, both financially for schools and still feeling some impact to learning post pandemic. SUMMER FAYRE









Camping was great fun as I made new friends.

French Language Day

Children in KS2 had a lot of fun on French Language Day, discovering some of the countries around the world where French is spoken. Year 3 enjoyed a French breakfast and took part in a virtual tour of Paris before learning the popular French bowling game Petanque. Year 4 were fascinated by the mountains, cuckoo clocks and delicious chocolate of Switzerland and explored the works of Swiss artist Paul Klee. Year 5 focussed on Senegal learning to describe traditional clothing. They showed off their dance moves with some fabulous west African dancing and made art work based on the artist Souleymane Keita. In Year 6 students discovered the geography of Mali and the story of Sundiata Keita, founder of the Mali Empire. They learned about the artist Abdoulave Konate and recreated one of his pieces using wax, paint and paper. Magnifique!

Bikeability



A number of children across Years 3 and 4 recently took part in Bikeability training Level 1. This course is a structured and standardised programme designed to make children more competent cyclists and prepare them for eventually cycling on road. The children worked on how to prepare their bike for a journey, checking tyre pressure, brakes and wheels. Over the two day course the children practised how to start and stop, looking over their shoulders for hazards, signalling before turning left or right, snaking and sharing space with other cyclists. Well done to all of the children who participated.

Are you caring for a child who is not yours?

Private fostering is when someone who is not a close relative cares for another person's child under the age of 16 for 28 days or more.

A close relative is considered to be an aunt, uncle, grandparent, step parent or siblings. Friends of the family and other family members are not classed as close relatives for the purposes of Private Fostering.

You need to legally notify Redbridge Children's Services of any private fostering arrangements in Redbridge to ensure the child is safe.
