### **Early Years**

## CITIZENS UK

As a school, we are proud to be members of Redbridge Citizens, which is part of Citizens UK. This alliance of over 450 member organisations unites communities to act together for power, social justice and the common good. Its diverse membership includes schools, churches, mosques, synagogues, parents' groups, charities and trade unions.

The aim of Citizens is to participate in public life. Members work hard to hold politicians and other decision-makers to account on the issues that matter in order to win victories that change lives and transform communities. For example, founded by Citizens UK in 2001, the Living Wage Movement has won over £1.3 billion of additional wages, lifting over 180,000 people out of working poverty. Some of the current national campaigns include: affordable homes and renters rights, refugee resettlement, better mental health access and affordable routes to citizenship for migrants.









## CŤTiZENS<sub>UK</sub>

Our Year 5 pupils have been discussing youth safety and thinking about changes they would like to see in our local area. A couple of weeks ago a number of children had the honour of presenting their views to the Labour and Conservative electoral candidates at a Citizen's event held at Palmer Catholic Academy. They asked Councillor Jas Athwal and Has Ahmed, to commit to ensuring:

- improved opportunities for workshops in all schools on 'how to keep safe'
- consultation with schools to improve transport availability at key times of the day
- continuation of the provision for young people in Redbridge

Needless to say, our pupils were inspirational and we are very proud of them!


