
### SATs Results

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

We hope you will find this useful – please feel free to send us feedback about your pack so that we can gauge how useful it's been!




Mayespark is a large primary school and sometimes it can be difficult to know who everyone is! We have many different teams of staff and we all work together to ensure our children achieve their best!


# READING

At Mayespark we have very clear expectations regarding reading. This is simply because we know that children who read succeed! Please therefore expect leaders and teachers at Mayespark to promote reading throughout the year.


On the next page are the reading expectations for each year group. Please take the time to read these. We would like you to know that we don't just expect this of Mayespark children because we know the importance of reading, we also prioritise this at home in our own families:



As a teacher, I have studied the importance of reading and over time have observed the undeniable difference reading at home makes to children's overall attainment. I have therefore made sure I've always found the time to read a variety of books to my child. He has just started Year 1 and so now I also hear him read to me daily, even during the holidays! I know reading daily at home will help my son to achieve his best, I want this for the children at Mayespark too!



My children have been read to since they were very young. My youngest child is nearly two and continues to blow me away with her level of vocabulary and imaginative play. I am sure that this is largely thanks to the books that we read every day – it is an important part of her bedtime routine! My older children (aged 8 and 11) have developed a love for reading throughout the years, this is partly because they have always been read to but also our regular library trips. They often see my wife and I pick up our books if we have spare time and this has influenced them to do the same.



Reading at home doesn't require having to buy lots of books! We are so lucky to have a local library on our doorstep. Why not pop by one afternoon after school!





# READING

Below are the reading expectations for each year group. If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher.

	EYFS, Year 1&2	Year 3&4	Year 5&6	
Reading to your child	Read different books to your child at least 6 days a week for at least 15 minutes.	It is still important that parents/carers read to older children. This may involve reading together and talking about non-fiction texts. For example, a newspaper article or an information book about a topic they are interested in.		
Hearing your child read	Listen to your child read their RWI/ book bag book or school banded book at least six days a week. Talk about what they have read referring to the questions in your child's home reading record.	Children are to read their banded book at least 6 days a week for about 20-30 minutes a day. Talk about what they have read referring to the questions in your child's home reading record.	Children are to read their banded book at home at least 6 days a week for at least 30 minutes a day. Non-banded books can be read only when first checked by a teacher and after every two banded books have been read.	
Signing your child's reading record	Sign and date your child's home reading record each day, recording the book they have read to you.	making a note of the page numb told by their teacher they are an	and date your child's reading record each day they read, king a note of the page numbers. Once your child has been by their teacher they are an 'Independent Reader', they may fer to complete their reading record themselves and parents sign just once a week.	
Changing books	School books will be changed at least weekly and a school adult will sign your child's reading record weekly. Class teachers will check home reading records daily and will hear your child read once every three weeks.	Children can change their reading book whenever they need to. Class teachers will check reading records daily and will sign / comment in your child's reading record once every three weeks.
