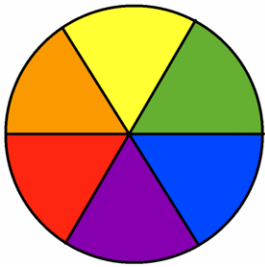




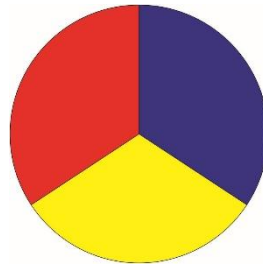
Key Knowledge



This is a colour wheel. It helps us to understand how different colours are connected.

Primary Colours

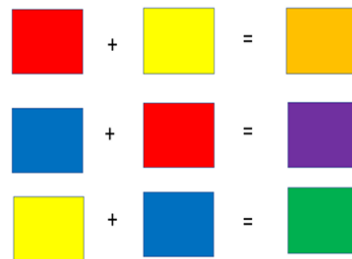
There are three **primary colours** - yellow, blue and red. These colours cannot be created by mixing other colours.



Mixing primary colours will create new colours called **secondary colours**.

Secondary Colours

There are three **secondary colours** - green, purple and orange.



Adding white to a colour makes it lighter. This is called a **tint**.

Adding black to a colour makes it darker. This is called a **shade**.

Key Vocabulary

Meaning

tint	created by adding white to a colour, making it lighter
shade	created by adding black to a colour, making it darker
abstract art	art which uses colours, lines and shapes but does not represent objects or living things.
mix	combining two or more colours together
artist	someone who creates artwork
primary colours	yellow blue and red
secondary colours	green purple and orange

Did you know...

Wassily Kandinsky was a famous artist born in 1866 in Russia.

He enjoyed experimenting with colours and **mixed** colours together to create new ones.

Kandinsky loved using bright colours and shapes to create paintings and was one of the first artists to create **abstract art**.
